## Main barriers to educational achievement

- 1. Emotional & Behavioural difficulties
- 2. Low attendance, medical concerns & young carers, social difficulties
- 3. Lack of support for learning within the home environment
- 4. Dyslexia & general learning difficulties

How will barriers be addressed?	Spend
1. Extra Midday Supervising Assistant (MSA); Teaching Assistant (TA) support & personal plan/SENDCo input, Talkboost intervention programme	£9000
2. Support for music lessons, extra-curricular activities, SENDCO input & educational visits	£4000 & link with sports premium
3. Extra support at school, Fresh Start intervention sessions, Talkboost, Reading & Maths cafes & e-safety workshops, Booster classes	£8000
4. TA training, support from TAs, SENDCO support, SALT (Speech and Language Therapy) sessions	£17700

Attendance above 90%, reduced unauthorised absences Increased % Pupil Premium children learning an instrument Improved progress in Reading, Writing & Maths Greater confidence & enjoyment	Average PP attendance above 90% in all year groups except Y1. Y5 & 6 achieved attendance above 95%.  11 PP children in Y3 & Y4 are learning an instrument in class. A further 8 PP children learn an instrument individually.
Phonics progression; Reading Scores, Key Skills acquisition Parents supporting homework. Parental attendance at support sessions	Maths 76% PP children have made expected progress or better. Writing 67% PP children have made expected progress or better.

Reading 89% PP children have made expected progress or better.
92% of parents report that their child makes good progress at school
