If residential visits are allowed later in the year a visit to an outdoor activity Centre could be arranged to provide further opportunities to access different outdoor physical activities. A full audit of physical activities and the uptake by children to be undertaken so clear information is available and children who do not usually engage in physical activity can be supported and encouraged to join in, for example with after school sporting activities when these can be resumed.
