Year 3 Curriculum Map - Summer Term I

English

This term, we will explore two exciting stories. 'The Star In The Jar' and a wordless picture book, 'The Journey'. The children will be immersed in descriptive language and gain an understanding of using a variety of punctuation and sentence types to create suspense and excitement.

Key Vocabulary:

Fronted adverbials, time adverbials, expanded noun phrases, adverbs, adjectives and punctuation.

Music

We are learning about what life was like for children in Victorian times. Comparing rich and poor children lives.

We are moving across to the continent of South America where we will learn about the country and then explore the Amazon Rainforest.

Key vocabulary:

Northern and southern hemispheres, equator, climate, rainforest, species.

The children have returned from the Easter break fully rested and have settled nicely back into our routines and learning. I have been very impressed by how many children are now beginning to join their handwriting and we will keep practising this cursive style. Homework: I am changing the way we do spellings this term so will not be sending home a paper copy. Instead your child can access their spellings on Spelling Shed where they can complete games and tasks each week. We are recapping the 2,5,10 and 3 times table this half-term, please practise these at home to reinforce their learning.

Chn have a copy of the practical home learning tasks in their green homework books, please sign and date once they have completed a task, once your child has completed 5 they will receive a Bronze certificate, complete 10 and they will get a Silver certificate and finally once all 15 have been completed then they will receive the Gold certificate.

Reading Books: These will be sent home sometime during their first week back, please make sure your child brings it into school every day along with their reading record book which needs to be filled in when your child has read. Those who are free readers can fill it in themselves if they want to. Books that are returned will be placed in a box and quarantined for 72 hours before someone else can borrow it.
