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Year 4 Curriculum Map

Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

Welcome to Year 4 and the start of what will be a great year.

Below you will find useful information for you to help during the working week.

TUESDAY: PE KIT is needed and must be worn to school as from next week. See below for proper school PE kit.

THURSDAY: This is an important day where a lot must be remembered. It is going to be a **PE day and Welly Day**. Your child will be wearing the same clothes on this day.

They need to be in their PE Kit: **Black** or **Blue** shorts or joggers for warmth, a white t-shirt and either the school logo-ed PE hoodie, a Black or Blue hoodie or a school sweatshirt.

For Welly day your child can then just put their joggers over their shorts and put their wellies on. Waterproof trousers are provided, however waterproof coats are also a must for when the weather becomes cold and wet. I hope this is clear, it should help any disagreements about what to wear too.

Packed Lunch boxes will be kept in the classroom. Snacks for breaktime need to be healthy, please no chocolate bars! Children need to be bringing water, not squash in their water bottles too. This is school policy and one that we need to enforce.

Reading: We are expecting your child to read to you each day, this needs to be 10 minutes at least. Please record in their reading record book. This needs to be returned to school everyday too. Establishing a routine with reading at home is so important, we want your children to enjoy reading and be able to read a variety of books throughout the year.

Timestables: It is a curriculum requirement that all year 4 children know ALL their tables by the end of Year 4. Your children will be officially tested in June. We will be working hard with this in school, however we need your help and encouragement at home too. I will send more information to help you once the term is underway, but please understand it is a school/ home effort to succeed at this.



History

We look at Anglo-Saxon life, finding out about Anglo-Saxon culture including art, music, legends and poetry.

Key Vocabulary: Anglo Saxon, north, south, east, west, community, settlements, artefacts, invaders, settlers, saxon graves, kingdoms, Anglo-Saxon place names, cremation, dyke, runes

Geography:

We will locate and name the main countries and cities in and around Norfolk.

We will also name and locate key topographical features (including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers) in the UK.

Key Vocabulary: Countries, counties, regions, compass points N,S,E W. Urban, rural, village, town, city, ocean, coastline, legacy

PSHE

Pupils will recognise their worth as individuals, by identifying positive things about themselves and their achievements, seeing their mistakes, making amends and setting personal goals; The children will face new challenges positively by collecting information, looking for help, making responsible choices and taking action; they will recognise the different risks in different situations and then decide how to behave responsibly;
