Welly Day and PE

We are really lucky this term as Miss Craske will be taking Year 2 out for Welly Day on **Tuesday mornings**.

Spring


English

This term, the children will be:

- Exploring different poems by Michael Rosen and Valerie Bloom. They will write their own humorous poem.
- -We will read 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of The Dark' by Jill Tomlinson and write their own animal adventure stories.
- In Term 2, we will focus on 'The Day the Crayons Quit' concluding with writing our own persuasive letter.

Vocabulary

Onomatopoeia, rhythm, rhymes, repetition, word play, verses, paragraphs, punctuation, description, persuasive, letter.





Mathematics

This term, we will start off by focusing on money by recognising and using coins up to £2 and notes up to £10. If you are able to use money with your children at home to aid recognition then this would help support this area of learning - they are so used to just seeing us use cards these days!

Then, we will continue to use manipulatives to support us in understanding multiplication and division.

<u>Vocabulary</u>

Money, totals, multiplication, repeated addition, division, sharing, grouping.

Term 2.

We begin by exploring Length and Height and then Mass, Capacity and Temperature. Any measuring at home will help support this area of the curriculum.

Vocabulary

<u>l</u>ength, height, width, area, perimeter, milli-metres, centimetres, metres, weight, mass, heavier, lighter, liquid, capacity, volume, colder, warmer, celsius, temperature.

Computing. Programming - Robot Algorithms

Learners will use given commands in different orders to investigate how the order affects the outcome. They will also learn about design in programming.

Term 2 Computing Systems & Networks - IT around us

With an initial focus on IT in the home, learners explore how IT benefits society in places such as shops, libraries, and hospitals.

RE

Why do people have different views about the idea of God?

We will find out how different religions view God.

Vocabulary

Agnostic, Allah, Atheist, Brahman, God, Humanist, Theist.

Term 2 RE Day: Why does Easter matter to Christians?

We will explore what Christians believe happened to Jesus at Easter.

<u>Vocabulary</u>

Christian, cross, crucifixion, Jesus, resurrection, salvation

Science Animals including humans

The children will learn about animals including humans exploring how they grow and develop. We will investigate different ways of grouping animals based on animal characteristics: what they eat, how they reproduce, and where they live.

<u>Vocabulary</u>

Survive, survival, baby, adult, dairy, carbohydrate, protein, fruits, vegetables, heart, muscle, exercise, stretch, warm-up, healthy.



Term 2 Plants

We will focus on plants, including observation skills and exploring how they grow and develop. We will investigate different things plants need to survive and grow our own plants.

Vocabulary


wild plants, garden plants, deciduous, evergreen, tree, trunk, branches, leaf, root, plant, leaves, bud, flowers, blossom, petals, stem.



History Nurturing Nurses

We will be exploring the difference between hospitals in the past and now. Pupils will also learn about Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole.

Vocabulary hospital, nurse, war, women, skills, cause, significant, bravery, Crimean war, soldier, famous, wounds.



Term 2 Black History – Rosa Parks and the civil rights movement

Why is learning about black history important? What can we learn from Rosa Parks and Nelson Mandela?

Vocabulary
Black, equality, freedom, rights, peace, acceptance





Geography Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?

Where are the hot and cold countries on a globe and on a map?

Contrast Kenya with the UK. The location of hot areas of the world in relation to the Equator.

Vocabulary

globe, equator, Kenya, country, continent, Africa, lake, mountain, grasslands, savannah, hot, polar, ice, cold, icebergs



Art and Design Be An Architect

Pupils will become familiar with the term 'architecture' and familiarise themselves with significant architects.

They will construct 3D forms and then reflect upon this process.

<u>Vocabulary</u>

Architect, Architecture, model, scale, imagination

Term 2 Expressive Painting

Year 2 will explore how painters use paint in expressive and gestural ways. They will experiment with mark making to create abstract still lifes.

Vocabulary Imagination, energy, impression, colour, Life, Shape, Form, Texture, Line, Mark Making, Primary Colours.

Design & Technology Textiles: Sewing

Children learn how to sew and join fabrics using a running stitch to design and make a keyring.

<u>Vocabulary</u> sew, fabric, needle thread, running stitch.

Term 2 Structures

Children will learn about different types of structures found in the natural world and in everyday objects. They will make a chair 'for baby bear' according to some design criteria and then test and evaluate their structure.
