Dear Parents/Carers.

I hope you've had a lovely relaxed and well rested Christmas and New Year break. Please find this term's curriculum map at the bottom of this page. This will give you a brief highlight of all the learning taking place until Easter.

Things to remember:

Miss Flower teaches the class daily.

Mrs Lawrence will now teach the class on Thursday afternoon to cover my planning time.

Mrs Hobbs supports the class on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday.

Mrs Morant supports the class on Wednesday.

- 1. Please bring a coat to school **every day.** Please ensure it is **waterproof** as we will still send the children out to play in most weather!
- 2. Water only in water bottles. If you wish to bring a snack: fruit or healthy choices only.
- 3. It is **vital** reading folders are in school **every day** we can only listen to your child read if their book is in school
- 4. Please do not allow your child to bring in toys from home as we will not take any responsibility if they are lost or broken and they cause great distraction during the school day.

Where possible please try to pass on messages or ask any questions at the end of the school day as staff will have more time to discuss your concerns. We are finding it increasingly difficult to meet the needs of the children in the mornings as the number and regularity of messages has greatly increased. If you feel we need to know something to support your child that day, please speak to Hannah in the office who will pass these onto the Year 1 team.

PE and Welly Day (note change of day):














English

During this term the children will be exploring Traditional Tales. The children will be recognising predictable phrases within Traditional Tales and retelling their own stories. We will then explore non-fiction texts and begin to identify the differences between texts. Finally we will learn how to write instructional texts and the purpose of written instructions.

Key Vocabulary:

Traditional tale, Noun, Plural, Capital Letter, Exclamation Mark, Repeated phrase, Rhyme, Glossary, Contents, Fact Box, Heading, Caption, Imperative or Bossy verbs.



Mathematics

Across the course of this term we will be exploring:

- Place Value to 50
- Addition/ Subtraction to 20
- Length and Height
- Mass and Volume

Key vocabulary:

Compare, Plus, Minus, Tens, Ones, Length, Height, Centimetres, Mass, Volume, Grams, Litres, Millilitres, Taller, Shorter, Longer, Heavier, Lighter, Full, Empty.

Flourish

The children will learn to recognise when they are finding things difficult, how to work with their peers and how to have a positive outlook to help them achieve their dreams. They will also consider how to be safe and keep healthy.

Key Vocabulary:

Success, Celebration, Challenge, Feelings, Goals, Dreams, Stepping stones, healthy eating, safety


Religious Education


This term we will explore the question 'What do my senses tell me about the world of religion and belief?'. The children will consider their senses and religion. They will be encouraged to ask 'I wonder' questions about the world around them and use these questions to investigate worship practices and use visual art, artefacts, stories and music.

Key Vocabulary: Belief, Reason Religion Sense, Worship, Philosophy.

Art

The children and intention







The children will explore materials and intention through a playful approach to create their own sculpture. We will also be Exploring watercolour and discovering we can use accidental marks to help us make art.

Key Vocabulary:

Sculpture, Three Dimensions, Explore, Construction, Materials, Imagine

Computing

The children will explore the world of digital art and its exciting range of creative tools such as digital paint and photography. The children will create their own paintings and photos. They will also develop an understanding of technology and how it can help them and begin to name parts of computers and other devices.

Key Vocabulary:

iPad, Digital image, Photo, Video, Sound,

D&T

Begin to build structures, joining components together to create a finished product. Find out why we have bridges and explore different types of bridges. Using readily available materials explore ways to construct a bridge. Explore how they can be stronger, stiffer, longer and more stable.



Science Spring 1 - Animals:

The children will focus on classifying, sorting and grouping animals. The children will become familiar with and use technical terminology to describe animal groups. We will group animals according to what they eat (carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.)

Key Vocabulary:


Vertebrates, Mammals, Fish, Birds, Reptiles, Amphibians, Herbivores, Omnivores, Carnivores, Environment, Cold -blooded, Warm-blooded

Spring 2 - Plants:

The children will be working scientifically to notice changes around their natural environment. The children will understand what plants need and the basic structure of a plant.

Key Vocabulary:

Leaves, Blossom, Petals, Roots, Buds, Trunk, Branches, Stem, Bulb, Seed, Water, Nutrients, Light, Air.




History

The children will learn about the history of transport focussing on Cars, Planes and Trains and the chronology of when they were invented. They will understand significant historical events and answer questions using photographs and videos. We will compare old and new vehicles to find similarities and differences. The children will learn about George Stephenson and his involvement in the invention of Stephenson's Rocket. We will also study inventors Carl Benz (car) and The Wright Brothers (planes).

Key Vocabulary:

1830, Travel, Cart, Car, Automobile, Train, Tram, Environment, Journey Passengers, Improvement, Timeline, Order, Chronology





Music

To learn the song 'In the groove'. It has been arranged in six different styles: Blues, Baroque, Latin, Bhangra, Folk and Funk. Verbally appraise music, recognising and identifying some style of music using musical language.

Key Vocabulary:

Pitch, Tempo, pulse/beat, High, Low, Instruments, Improvise, compose, Styles, Blues, Latin, Folk, Funk, Baroque, Bhangra

Geography:

The children will learn about the 4 countries in the UK. The children will recognise England as the country we live in. They will also begin to name and locate the 3 other countries of the UK using a topical text for each country. The children will begin to understand some geographical similarities and differences of Stibbard and cities eg London.

Key Vocabulary:

City, Village, Landmark, England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, UK, flag, map, capital cities, London, Belfast, Edinburgh, Cardiff.
