<u>Curriculum Map:</u> Overleaf is a summary of what your child will be learning this half-term. Our theme this term is The Stone Age, where children will explore what life was like for our early ancestors, they will make dens in their Welly Day sessions and explore rocks and soils in Science.

Year 3 Curriculum Map - Spring Term 1

English

We are using the FANTASTICS, GRAMMARISTICS and **BOOMTASTICS** to help us write descriptive sentences and learn essential punctuation and grammar skills. We will read 'The Stone Age Boy' and then write an adventure story based on this text. Towards the end of this term, we will use 'How To Wash A Woolly Mammoth' to help us to write sets of instructions.

Key Vocabulary:

Fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases, synonyms, simple sentences, compound sentences, complex sentences.

Music

Children will be using the charanga music unit 'Three Little Birds' - a reggae song.

Key vocabulary:

Composing, rhythm, sampling, pulse, timbre, appraising, chord, harmony, .

DOT

Mechanisms

This half term we will be looking at mechanisms and creating a pneumatic toy.

Art Telling Stories through Drawing & Making

We will be exploring how artists are inspired by other art forms - in this case how we make sculpture inspired by literature and film.

Computing E-Safety & Sequencing

Children will get a taster of how to use simple coding programs and to make simple sequences.

French Instruments

In this unit we will learn 10 familiar instruments and be introduced to the 1st person singular high frequency verb 'I play'.


Religious Education


We will be exploring what Philosophy is and discuss how people across a range of religions make moral decisions.


PSHE/ RSE

Dreams & Goals

We will be looking at Aspirations, how to achieve goals and understanding the emotions that go with this.







Mathematics

Our focus remains on Multiplication and Division by looking at exchanges, partitioning and remainders.

Out next unit will be Length and Perimeter. Looking at measuring in millimetres, centimetres, metres and comparing these.

Key vocabulary:
Multiplication, division,
arrays, fractions,
comparing, perimeter.

Science

where we will compare how things move on different surfaces, know that some forces need contact but magnetic force can act at a distance.

Key Vocabulary:

As before with the introduction of the new vocabulary Force, push, pull, friction, surface, magnet, magnetic, magnetic field, pole, north, south, attract, repel, compass

History The Stone Age

Children will learn about the lives of people from the Stone Age through to the Iron Age

Key vocabulary:

Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic.

Geography:

Place knowledge: We are finding out about different countries in Europe and then will focus on Italy.

Year 3 Curriculum Map - Spring Term 2

English

During this second half of the term, we will continue to use the FANTASTICS to create exciting pieces of writing. We will finish 'How To Wash a Woolly Mammoth' which is instructional writing. Then, we will be delving into the magical story of 'Secret of Black Rock' and writing our own version of a colour poem, based on 'The Boy who couldn't see.'

Music

We will be using the Charanga scheme to explore the Dragon Song. A song about friendship, kindness, respect, tolerance, acceptance and happiness. We will be studying songs from other cultures and learning to create our own performances.

Key vocabulary: pulse, rhythm, beat,

composition, musical style.

D&T Structures

We will be creating;

Art Cloth, Thread, Paint and Explore

Children explore how artists use fabric, paint and thread to make work in response to landscapes.


Computing Binary and Loops

Students will learn how information is represented in a way such that a computer can interpret and store it.

Key Vocabulary: Binary, Byt, bit

French

I can Je Peux (I can)
We will recognise some common French verbs/activities and Use these verbs in the infinitive with je peux.







Religious Education What do Muslim's believe about their god?

The children will learn about Islam and Muslim's beliefs about God. They explore the Qur'an and its importance to Muslim's. Chn compare the differences and similarities between Christians and Muslim's beliefs about God.

Key vocabulary:

Muslims, Islam, God Quran, Tawhid, Allah

Mathematics

This half term we will be learning about fractions, mass and capacity.

Key vocabulary:

Volume, numerator, denominator, compare, equivalent, capacity, mass, grams, kilograms

Science

We are finding out all about Rocks, fossils and soil. We will compare different types of rocks and soils and discover how fossils were made. .

Key vocabulary:

metamorphic, sedimentary, igneous, permeable, absorbent. Books to support our

knowledge: The Pebble in my pocket

History The Stone Age

Children will discover the changes that took place in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.

Geography

We are focusing on Europe. The children will explore the different mountain ranges in Italy and learn about volcanoes.

Key vocabulary:

Mountains, volcano, tectonic plates erupt.

Flourish Lessons Healthy Me

This half term we will be looking at how we can keep fit and healthy. We will learn how to keep ourselves safe and know how to keep calm and deal with difficult situations.
