<p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <p>In preparation for SATs and becoming more knowledgeable about Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation we will be focusing on word types, improving sentence construction and recalling key terms.</p> <p>Later, we will watch the film The Present and use it as a stimulus for writing our own stories.</p> <p>VOCABULARY: disability, onomatopoeia, relative clause, subordinating conjunctions, metaphor</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Mathematics</p> <p>Children will learn statistics this term - reading and interpreting tables and line graphs, drawing line graphs, measuring using a protractor, circles and interpreting pie charts. Year 6 will be recapping methods and practising SATS style questions.</p> <p>Children will learn about shape, position and direction, Decimals, negative numbers, converting units and volume.</p> <p>VOCABULARY: y and x axis, plot, column, row, digital time, 24 hour clock, obtuse, acute, right angle, degrees, fraction, radius, diameter, circumference</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Circulatory System, health and nutrition</i></p> <p>We will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood.</p> <p>We will recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function.</p> <p>We will describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.</p> <p>Vocab: heart, pulse rate, pumps, blood, blood vessels, transported, lungs, oxygen, carbon dioxide, nutrients, water, muscles, cycle, circulatory system, diet, exercise, drugs, lifestyle, bar chart, line graph</p>
<p>VOCABULARY: disability, onomatopoeia, relative clause, subordinating conjunctions, metaphor</p>  <p>We will read Viking Boy and the children will write their own adventure story set in that time.</p> <p>VOCABULARY: blood oaths, Viking, Valkyries, Bifrost, Misgard, Asgard, Valhalla, vengeance, quest, amulet</p> <p>We will read 'The Switch', a body swap story which explores themes of gratitude and 'taking care of what you wish for'. We will explore Anthony Horowitz's description</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Computing <i>Flat File Databases</i></p> <p>We will find out how data is stored and managed, how a flat file database is used to organise data in records. Pupils use tools within a database to order and answer questions about data.</p> <p>They will create graphs and charts from their data to help solve problems.</p> <p>VOCAB: database, flat-file database, sort, field, value and chart.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Religious Education</p> <p>Enquiry Question : How do Hindus make sense of the world?</p> <p>Children will learn about the origins of Hinduism and the Vedas or religious Hindu texts. They will learn how dharma influences the way a Hindu lives their life. They will learn about the belief in samsara (cycle of life) karma and moksha. They will look at the three major gods and their roles - Shiva, Vishnu and Brahma. They will look at the story of Ganga and Shiva to discover why Shiva is so important to Hindus. Children will learn about the festival of Holi and its significance to Hindus.</p> <p>VOCABULARY: Ahimsa, Atman, Avatars, Brahman, Caste system, Dharma, Karma, Moksha, Ramayana, Samsara, Holi Festival, Vedas</p> <p>Enquiry Question: What does Shabbat mean to Jewish</p>

We will compare and contrast old and modern maps, observe and extract information from primary sources and artefacts - school log book, old coins, old photographs and look at the census.</p> <p>VOCAB: Census, memorial, artefact, secondary source, primary source, world war, Home Front, Industrial Revolution, Urban, rural, legacy, Domesday Book, William the Conqueror</p>	<p>Geography Fieldwork study</p> <p>Combined with our history work we will look in the local area at fieldwork studies.</p> <p>We will use field work to observe measure, record and present human and physical features</p> <p>We will learn that geographers conduct fieldwork to gather information in the real world. They find out about real fieldwork happening today around the world. RHSE - Flourish Lessons Relationships

Children will learn how to look after their mental health. We will explore the stages of grief and how there are different types of loss that cause people to grieve. Children will learn about power and control, recognising fake from genuine and how to keep safe online.

We will explore how our body image is connected to our self image. We will learn about changes in puberty and how to look after ourselves physically and emotionally. We will describe how a baby changes during its nine months in the womb. We will explore feeling associated with transition to High School.

VOCAB: self-image, self-esteem, opportunities, freedoms, responsibilities, attraction, consent, sexting, pressure, identity, transition, journey, anxiety, worries, hope

Music

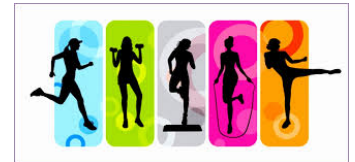
Music & Me
