Year 3 Curriculum Map - Summer Term 1

English

We are continuing to use the FANTASTICS. **GRAMMARISTICS** and **BOOMTASTICS** to help us write descriptive sentences and learn essential punctuation and grammar skills. We begin the term with a comedy called 'The Incredible Book Eating Boy' by Oliver Jeffers and then onto a traditional Chinese tale called 'The Magic Paintbrush' by Julia Donalson.

Key Vocabulary:

Synonyms, simple sentences, compound sentences, complex sentences.

Music Bringing us Together

This term Y3 will be embracing Disco music. The children will focus on learning around a song in key musical areas which, over time, all contribute towards the steadily increasing development of musicianship: • Listening • Singing • Playing • Improvising and Composing • Performing

D&T Mechanisms for Pop-up Books

We will be exploring how pop-up books work, evaluating ones we have around us and having a go at making our own mini pop-up books.

Art Animation

Children will explore how to create simple moving drawings by making paper "puppets" and animate them using tablets.

Computing Online Safety: online relationships

Describe online friendships, online / offline behaviour, explore trust, people's feelings can be affected by online behaviour, giving / gaining permission.


Key vocabulary:

interests, likes / dislikes, online / offline behaviour, trust, feelings, permission, sharing.

French Fruits

They will learn how to add 'I like' and 'I don't like' to create simple sentences.







Mathematics

In maths this term, we will continue to develop our understanding of fractions and time.

Key vocabulary:

Fraction, equivalent fraction, numerator, denominator, time, quarter past, quarter to, O'Clock, month, year, am, pm.

Science Plants

We are learning about plant systems and reproduction. We will be using the following books to support our learning, 'The Dandelion Seed' by Joseph Anthony and 'A Seed Is Sleepy' by Dianna Hutts Aston and Sylvia Long

Key vocabulary: roots, stem/trunk, leaves, flowers, pollination, germination, fertilisation and seed dispersal.

History Victorians

What was life like for children in Victorian times? Comparing rich and poor children's lives.

Key vocabulary:

Workhouse, orphan, orphanage, poverty, destitute.

Geography:

We are moving across to the continent of South America where we will learn about the country and

then explore the Amazon Rainforest.

Kev vocabulary:

Northern and southern hemispheres, equator, climate, rainforest, species.

Religious Education

We will learn about Muslim's and their beliefs about God, explore the five Pillars and the importance of the 5 duties to the daily lives of Muslims. Then we will compare the differences and similarities between Christians and Muslim's beliefs about God.

Key vocabulary:

Muslims, Islam, God Quran, Tawhid, Allah, Shahadah, Salah, Zakat, Sawm, Hajj

PSHE/ RSE Relationships

We will be learning about different kinds of relationships and friendships. We will discuss how to solve problems with our friends, keeping ourselves safe online and how to be a good global citizen.

Year 3 Curriculum Map - Summer Term 2

English

This term, we will continue with "The True Story of The Three Little Pigs' by Jon Scieszka which is a twist on the traditional fairy tale. Y3 wil also write an explanation text titled 'How A Robot Dog Works.'

Key Vocabulary:

Fronted adverbials, time adverbials, expanded noun phrases, adverbs, adjectives, conjunctions, subordinate clauses and punctuation.

Music

Reflect, Rewind and Replay This term, there will be a focus on Western Classical Music.

Key vocabulary:

pulse, rhythm, beat, composition, musical style.

DOT

Structures

We will be continuing our pop-up books.

Using Natural Materials to make images.

Using natural pigments and dyes from the local environment to make art. Exploring Cyanotype and Anthotype.

Computing Events and Data

Collect data from Play Lab and visualise it using different graphs.

French Ice Creams

In this unit the children will learn how to: name and recognise up to 10 different flavours for ice creams. Ask for an ice-cream in French using 'je voudrais'. Key Vocabulary: Une glace - an ice-cream Un

cornet - a cone

Je voudrais - I would like







Religious Education

RE day - What do Christians learn from the creation story?

PSHE/RSE Changing Me

Pupils will explore how our bodies change as we grow up and the reasons for these changes.

Mathematics

In maths this term, we will continue with geometry, focussing on vocabulary on lines and angles as well as the names of common 2D and 3D shapes. Following this, we will focus on measurement: length, height, mass, volume & capacity and a recap of all 4 operations (+-x÷).

Key vocabulary:

Acute angle, obtuse angle, right angle, parallel, perpendicular, vertical, horizontal, multiples, multiplication tables, addition, subtraction, column method. multiplication, division, product, fractions,

Science Light and Shadow

We will examine the differences between light and day and how humans see objects.

Key wcabulary: Light source, dark, reflect, ray, mirror, bounce, visible, beam, sun, glare, travel, straight, opaque, shadow, block, transparent, translucent.

History How has childhood in Britain chanaed?

We are continuing to build on our learning about what life was like for children in Victorian times.

Key vocabulary:

Workhouse, school, orphan, orphanage, poverty, destitute, Barnardo Geography:

We are still focusing on South America where we will explore the Amazon Rainforest and the species that live there.

Key vocabulary:

Rainforest, species, climate, forest floor, understorey, canopy, Emergents.
